




CLASS SIZE





Students meeting state grade-level expectations.




MATHEMATICS

About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Banks Middle School is committed to cultivating a culture of kindness. We utilize multi-tiered systems of support (MTSS) to identify students in need of support in academic, social, behavioral, and/or emotional areas and implement a system of interventions to support student needs. Bullying and harassment are taken seriously and our administrative team works closely with students and families to address concerns and repair harm. As a district we are also members of the SafeOregon.com safety threat reporting network.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

At BMS, we offer many opportunities for our students to enrich their middle school experience outside the hours of the regular school day. We support the following activities to enrich our students' academic, physical, and social well-being: Homework Club, Chess Club, and Banks Youth Sports. We also take our 6th graders to outdoor school.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

We have a Parent Teacher Organization at BMS, which hosts our school dances, 8th grade promotion, and provides other enriching activities and materials for our program. The PTO also provides the volunteer support that makes possible our annual events like Registration Day, field trips, and Field Day. Parents receive regular newsletters, and can learn about how to support their children at information nights. Additionally, all parents are encouraged to attend student-teacher conferences, assemblies, and music performances.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

BMS has a strong fine arts program which puts on multiple performances throughout the year, including band and choir concerts. We have an annual science fair, which is open to the community and includes presentations from BMS students. BMS, as the newest facility in the district, regularly provides the space for community sporting events, gatherings, and fundraisers.
